

ANSWERS TO ANIMAL HUSBANDRY ASSIGNMENT.

- A. Sanitation: Sanitation is a management practice in animal production whereby farmers keep the farm environment clear and clean all the time. One of the major reasons of maintaining a high level of sanitation is to prevent the outbreak and spread of diseases in the farm.
- B. Delousing: Delousing is another management practice in animals production whereby animals are dipped or sprayed or sometimes washed with certain or suitable chemicals to remove ecto-parasites from their body.
- C. Drenching: Drenching is also known as deworming. It is a management practice in animal reproduction whereby animals are given certain drugs to remove worms inside their body(stomach).
- D. Steaming up: This is a process of giving highly nutritious diet to a pregnant animal for a few weeks before parturition to stimulate milk synthesis and secretion.
